The ancient Egyptians accomplished many achievements these included:

- Hieroglyphics - writing
- Pyramids
- Irrigation
- Paper
- Black ink
- The number 0 and decimals
- Mummification

Where is Egypt located?

Egypt is located in North Africa.

Irrigation	<i>The supply of water that assists the growth of land and crops.</i>
Egyptologist	<i>an archeologist who focuses on Egypt.</i>
After Life	<i>the place Egyptians believed that they would go after they died.</i>
Pharaoh	<i>the supreme ruler of Ancient Egypt.</i>
Mummification	<i>the process of preserving a body after death in preparation for the after life.</i>
Sarcophagus	<i>a large stone box which held a mummy's coffin, often richly decorated for Pharaohs.</i>
Canopic Jars	<i>jars which held the organs of a mummy, including: lungs, intestines, liver and stomach.</i>
Papyrus	<i>a plant which grew on the banks of the River Nile. It was used for the early forms of paper</i>

Pyramid - ancient stone structures built as tombs for the Pharaohs.

Hieroglyphics - symbols that form pictures used in writing.
