I will be able to tell you how medicine from all the time periods was used to cure various diseases.

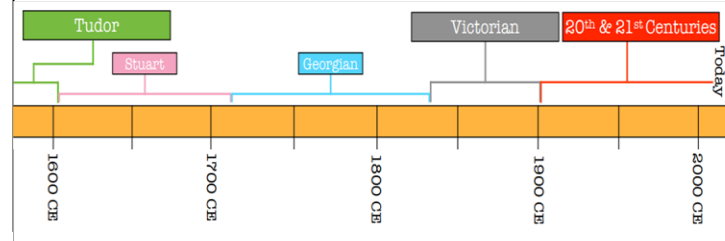
