- Children have played with toys, even thousands of years ago.
- In Victorian times, girls played with dolls and tea sets. Boys played with toy soldiers and marbles.
- Poorer children made their own toys, such as clothes-peg dolls or hopscotch.
- In modern times, toys are made in factories and often need batteries to work.









- Old toys are often fragile or threadbare.
- Some toys are displayed in toy museums so people can find out facts about them.
- They are kept in display boxes to protect them from dust.
